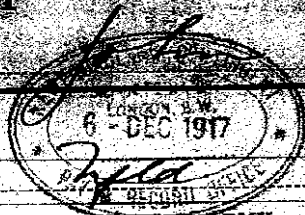

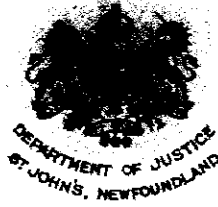

Dear Madam:

I beg to inform you that you have been appointed Administratrix of the estate of your son, John C. Barnes, #3614. I have forwarded the Letters of Administration to Major Howley, who will send them to you together with a cheque for the amount due from the Pay & Record Office. According to law, after his debts are paid, you are bound to divide the residue of his estate in equal shares between yourself, his brothers and sisters, and if there are any children of a deceased brother or sister they would be entitled to their father's or mother's share in the estate.

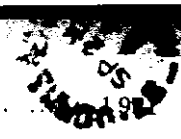

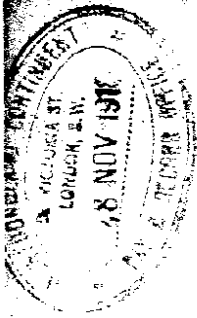
