Letter received from Director of Medical Services Dec. 8th. 1917 stated above noted man was ordered to report to Depot on December 10th. for orders. He never reported to Depot. Some days after that date I sent Regimental Police to his Boarding house to enquire the reason of delay in reporting and they were informen that Boone had proceeded to his home. This fact I notified personally to the Director of Medical Services's Office by Phone as I thought it likely Boone had misunderstood in his instructions. On checking Nominal books sometime later I noted this man still carried on the Strength, and wrote the Paymaster on February 9th. 1918 and pointed same out to him.

He was accordingly discharged from the Strength with effect from February 16th. as notified O.C. Depot, in letter from Paymaster February 22nd. With reference to his Regimental Pay, as far as I can remember, his account was never carried

on Company Pay Sheets but was handled direct by the Pay Department, so that I am not in a position to say if he received his pay or not. Regarding his disability, that is a matter of which the Depot authorities have no knowledge but is handled direct I understand, by the Secretary of the Pensions Board.
