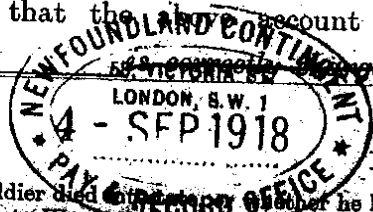



Private Eric Burt, No. 1152, Newfoundland Regiment, has been sick for some time and has been back from France and examined and found unfit for service, and is now on furlough at the War Hospital, Dundee. His parents are anxious, if it would be possible at all, to have him come home to spend his furlough.

Would you please see what can be done, and let me know at your earliest convenience.

This chap went over with the second draft and has been on active service ever since, until wounded last October, and he is anxious to come over here for his furlough before returning on active service again.
