I have the honour to state that L.Opl. Carter was buried with full Military honours, on the 8/5/17, at Wandsworth Cemetery.

He was interred in the Newfoundland Plot, (Grave No. 786).

The firing and bugle party consisted of men from the 3rd Training Reserve Battalion, Wimbledon.

The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag.

A wreath of red roses and laurel leaves was sent by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association, which bore the following inscription:

"In sincere admiration and regret for a good soldier  
"who fought the good fight for His Country's sake  
"and died in Her services."

Another wreath of mixed flowers, bearing the inscription,  
"In loving Memory of L.Opl. T. Carter, from his  
"comrades of R.S. Ward",  
was laid upon the coffin.

Amongst others who attended was Corporal J.G. Cummins, who represented the Pay & Record Office.

The Last Post was sounded, and a volley of Three Rounds Blank was fired at 3.30 p.m.

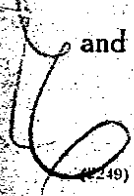
