No remission.

In arrest from 7/9/17 to date of trial.

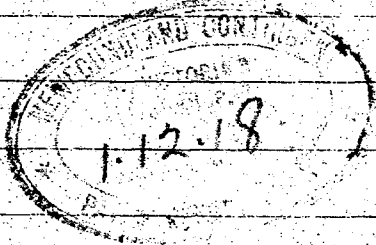
