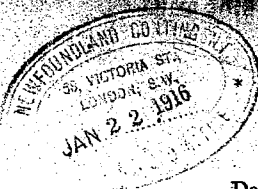

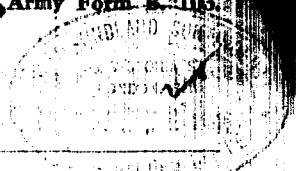

The undernoted report on 1 officer, 1st Newfoundland Regiment, wounded, 9/10/17, is forwarded in continuation of my Casualty List No. 25 11/10/17 and "Notice" on Casualty List No. 27 of 13/10/17.

"On the night of 9/10, 2/Lieut S.B. COLE was in our forward trench at the third objective. During the counter attack of the enemy after dark, 2/Lieut COLE was badly wounded, apparently by a bomb in the upper part of the right thigh.

When the retirement from that part of the line took place, 2/Lieut COLE was last seen lying face downward on the parapet, and was left for dead".

"On the evening of October 9th I saw 2nd
"Lieut. Cole wounded. It was about 7 p.m.,
"I was speaking to him. He was wounded
"seriously and I tried to bandage him but
"he was in great pain. I also wanted to
"take off his equipment but he refused to
"let me. I went to look for stretchers bearers
"and was none to be found. Then the counter at
"attack started and we withdrew and that was
"the last I saw of him."

Wounded and Missing 9/10/17.

I saw Mr. Cole after he was wounded on October
9th, about 4.0.p.m. He was hit in the stomach
and looked very bad indeed, I should think that he
would die from his wound. I was from 15 to 20
yards away and saw him hit by a shell. It was during
the attack at Ypres. Our Plat. was the next one.
I knew the Officer very well. I do not think anyone
moved him.
