I beg to inform you that, in accordance with your desire, I telegraphed the Record Office of the First Newfoundland Regiment, London, on Saturday last, and enquired whether they had received any news of your son, No. 1222, Private Daniel Curran.

I am to-day in receipt of a reply from the Record Office to the effect that they have received no report with respect to your son.

I think you may rest assured that he is neither wounded, nor seriously ill, because, in either event, a report of his case would immediately be made by the Regimental Authorities at the front to the Record Office in London, who would, in turn, forward the news to this office for transmission to the next of kin.
