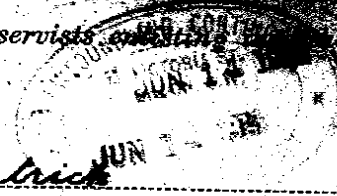

Dear Sir,

It was with the deepest regret that the Government received a cable from the Record Office, London, intimating that your brave son, Private Patrick Tegen had died of wounds in the Field Ambulance on the 2nd July instant. Permit me to express on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy with you in this time of sorrow. Naturally our hearts are bowed with grief at the loss of our loved ones, but it will no doubt be some consolation to you when you think that your gallant boy came forward early at the call of King and Country, and fought bravely in defence of the Principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. He has laid down the weapons of his earthly Warfare and now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory. His name will be inscribed on the Glorious Roll of Honor and he held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. We are proud of our brave Boys who so nobly came forward at the call of Duty, and we are also proud of the unselfish Fathers and Mothers who so loyally gave their boys when the call of duty came. He has gallantly done his part in the great struggle and died with his face to the foe, and when the time comes for the triumph of Right and the re-establishment of Peace in the world, it will be a grateful memory to you that he bore no small part in

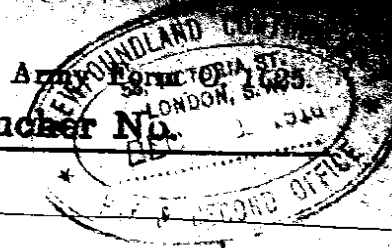
