Henry, had Died of Wounds at 8th Stationary Hospital, Rouen, on the 15th instant, and I wish to express to you and your family my sincerest sympathy in your time of sorrow.

In your bereavement I feel sure that you will find consolation in the thought that your son, was amongst the first who answered the call of King and Country, and gave his life in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty, and that his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen.
