"Dear Sir,-

"I wish to enquire from you
"as to the stoppage of pay from
"my late nephew Pte. Nicholas
"Evans who was killed in action
"on 1st. July. 1916. I have not
"received it since May 1917 and
"as the mothers of all the boys
"that was killed with him are
"getting their allotments right
"along I can't see why I should
"not get it also. He signed for
"participation of the War and I
"am entitled to it as well as those
"who are receiving it as he was
"my only one and I did all that
"a mother could do for him and
"my poor boy did not get time to
"do much for me. At present the
"cost of living is so high it is
"very hard to get along.

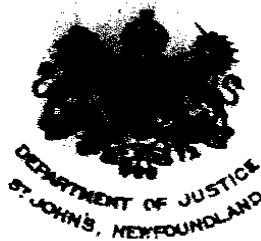

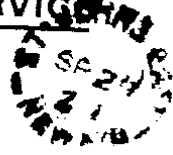
