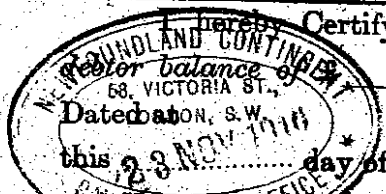

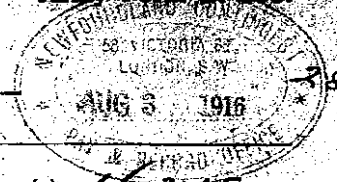

Sir,

With reference to your letter 16/10/16 on the subject of a parcel addressed to No. 1191, the late Pte. Stephen Fallon, it will doubtless be appreciated that with the large quantities of postal matter passing through this office from time to time, it is practically impossible to trace a packet unless registered. Further a considerable proportion of letters and packets are sent from Newfoundland direct to the Depot, Scotland for distribution and consequently do not go through this office.

With regard to this instance: the parcel having been posted in June it would probably have reached England late in June or early July, and considering that the report of your son's fatality did not reach this office until 31/7/16 the parcel would in the ordinary course have been forwarded to France.

A number of parcels etc. for those who have fallen have been returned here, and recently in accordance with instructions from Headquarters, St. John's, were sent and are being sent back to the G.P.O. Newfoundland through the usual postal channels. Possibly yours may be among the number.

If by any means the parcel should be returned here it will be dealt with as you desire.
