Sir, 3044, the late Pte. P.J. Farrell.

I have the honour to state that the late Pte. P. J. Farrell, of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, was buried with full military honours at Brookwood Cemetery on the 4/10/17.

The firing party and bearers consisted of a detachment from the 1st South African Reserve Battalion.

The coffin, which was covered with the Newfoundland flag, bore the following inscription:

Joseph Patrick Farrell,  
1st Newfoundland Regiment,  
Died 1st October, 1917,  
Aged 19 Years.

A Wreath of Laurel Leaves and Roses was sent by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association. Another Wreath of Roses was sent from unknown friends.

Pte. Farrell was interred in Grave No. 179839, Newfoundland Plot, Burial Service being conducted by the Chaplain, and the Last Post sounded at 1.30 p.m.
