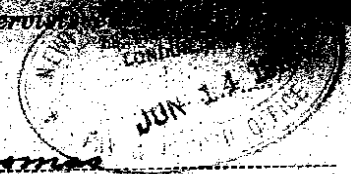

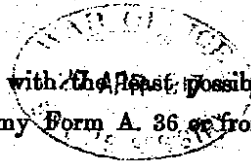

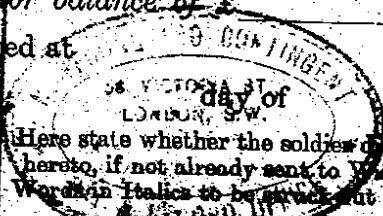

Dear Madam:-

Your letter of 31st ult. relative to the Cemetery Register Form forwarded to your from this Department for completion has been duly received.

I beg to state in reply to your enquiries regarding this Form that, although the grave of your son has not up to the present time been registered, it is possible that it may yet be located by the D.G.R.&E. whose efforts in endeavouring to locate the missing bodies and graves of soldiers, are still in progress. In the event of Private Fitzgerald's grave being located it will be removed into another cemetery, and a Memorial Cross will be erected in his memory. The Form in your possession refers to this Memorial, on which a space is reserved for a personal inscription of the next of kin. The pattern of the Memorial for men classed as missing has not yet been decided on, but in any case, it is likely that the same space will be reserved as on that of the Cross for a personal inscription, and I should be glad, therefore, if you will complete the attached Form, filling in the space marked (A)

Attention should be paid to the instructions regarding the length of this inscription: these will be found on 4 marked "Personal Inscription".

Dear Mr. Squires:-

Your letter of Feb. 4th concerning the case of Mrs. Hicks formerly Mrs. Fitzgerald, has been received.

I am informed by the Board of Pension Commissioners that this case was considered by them a day or two ago. That Board had been delayed considerably in securing certain information that they required before making a decision. The case is one that does not come under the ordinary schedule of pensions payable, but in view of the circumstances of the case, she has been allowed a pension of \$20.00 per month for twelve months, under Section 23 of the War Pensions Act, 1917. Mrs. Hicks will be receiving her cheques on the 1st of next month.
