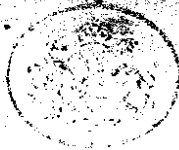

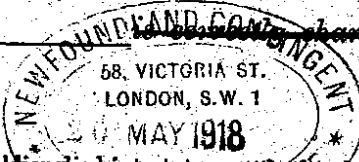

on the 9<sup>th</sup> July, 16 near Arras in France. As  
his name is not reported in the official lists  
that we have here, we request that H. J. Reeve  
may be examined as to whether the ~~Prisoner~~  
~~captured man~~ was wounded or unwounded when  
captured, and at what place investigation  
should be made.

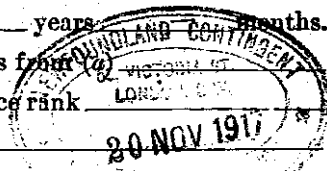
