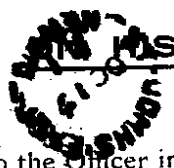

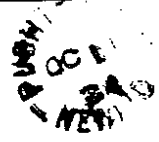

Dear Reverend Sir,

Your letter of the 22nd. ulto. addressed to
Lient. Col. W.F. Rendell has been passed to me for attention.

I note your remarks regarding the grave of the
late 4323 Private G.T. Fudge, and that a private monument has been
erected to his memory.

I have to inform you that this Department,
in the treatment of War Graves, is governed by the Regulations issued
by the Imperial War Graves Commission which asks for a form of
abandonment whereby the Commission can treat the grave in the same
manner as War Graves in war areas.

Hence, we would like to receive the permission
of Mr. Fudge to erect the Imperial Headstone and place a concrete curb
around the grave. Perhaps, if the Rector and Wardens were willing,
Mr. Fudge might like to place the private monument in the Church in the
form of a Memorial Tablet to the Memory of his son.

I have a parcel of bulbs, chrysanths, on hand
for this grave for immediate planting and spring blooming but cannot

forward until I receive the consent of the family to treat the grave as outlined above.

If the answer is in the affirmative will you kindly wire me collect as I am anxious to plant the bulbs this Fall.
