Sir:- 3148, the late Pte. C.L. Gillam.

I have the honour to state that the late Pte. Charles Llewellyn Gillam, of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, was buried with full military honours at Brookwood Cemetery on the 22/9/17.

The funeral party and bearers consisted of a detachment from the 2nd South African Reserve Battalion.

The coffin which was covered with the Newfoundland flag bore the inscription:

Charles Llewellyn Gillam,
1st Newfoundland Regiment,
Died 19th September, 1917,
Aged 19 years.

A wreath of Laurel Leaves and Red Roses was sent by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association. Amongst those who attended at the graveside was No. 1218, Cpl. T.M. Hussey, representing the Newfoundland Pay & Record Office.

Pte. Gillam was interred in Grave No. 179800, Nfld. Plot, Burial Service being conducted by the Rev. E.C. Walsh, Australian Chaplain, and the Last Post sounded at 1.45 p.m.

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 22nd instant and note your desire that the intimation of any future fatalities amongst the boys in your neighbourhood may be communicated to you first for transmission to the next of kin.

I may say that, in the case of Private Charles Gillam, to which you have reference in your letter, the notification of his death was, as is customary, sent to the clergyman, who, in this case, was Rev. E. A. Butler, of St. George's. As the notification, as you state, was sent to you, I presume that it was done by Mr. Butler or by somebody on his behalf, so that you, being on the spot or near the parents of the deceased soldier, might break the news. As the practice invariably is to send notice of the fatality to the clergyman, as I have already stated, I think it would be better if this rule be adhered to in any future instance concerning your locality and, if the clergyman so desires, he can, as has apparently been done in the present case, delegate the task of conveying the sad tidings to you or some other suitable person.

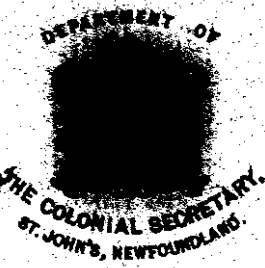

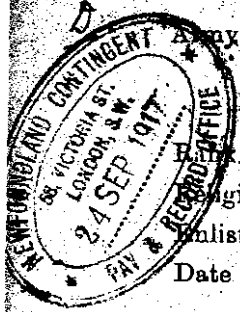
