

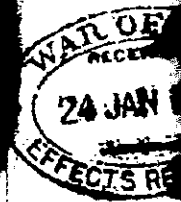
Excuse my sending you a few words it's about an interned Cpl. of the Newfoundland Regt who died at Interlaken in November 1918. As there is now Officers from Newfoundland Regt staying at Interlaken I feel much obliged to inform.

you that the Cpl. Goudie
1st Newfoundland Regt No 2246
was staying at the Hotel Brüning
Interlaken as British interned
from the 28th of December 1917
until the 15th of July 1918.
After that date the British interned
were moved to the Hotel du Nord
next door. As he did a lot of
sports with some of his friends
he wanted some extra food
and we advanced him for
a long time tea in the afternoon
what he has been having every
afternoon after being rowing
There is a bill who amounts
to frs. 193. whatever he promised
to pay before his Repatriation.
Unfortunately Cpl. Goudie
was taken sick by the Grippe
and died on the 16th of November

1918. The amount for food was
because he felted often hungry
and now trunks have been given
to him. Therefore I take the
liberty in sending you the
bill and I should feel much
obliged to you if you could
settle the matter. All the British
boys where very pleased to stay
at the Hotel Prunig Interlaken
and it has a very good name
amongst everybody.

The British Legation at Berne
is ready to give you any
information about the
Hotel Prunig, Interlaken
My sister has been writing
the British boys for 2 or 3
weeks in the most dangerous
time while they had the Grippe

I have the honour to inform you that the Supreme Court of Newfoundland has approved of the issue to you of Letters of Administration to this Estate.

Herewith I enclose a form which is to be signed by you as Administrator. You will sign in the place where I have marked a cross in black lead pencil. You will then swear to it before a Commissioner of the Supreme Court. If there is no Commissioner of the Supreme Court within two miles, you may swear to it before a Justice of the Peace. If there is not only no Commissioner of the Supreme Court, but also no Justice of the Peace within two miles, you may swear to it before either a Clergyman, Medical Doctor, or School Teacher. In this case, the Clergyman or other person will sign his name as a witness to the subscription of the oath; and the oath so subscribed shall have the same force and effect, both civilly and criminally, as if it had been sworn before the Commissioner.

Immediately upon the return of the form to this Office, steps will be taken to obtain Letters of Administration, which will be sent to the Pay and Record Office. The latter will then send letters and cheques for balance in that office to the Administrator for distribution to the next of kin.

My dear Major:-

I wonder if you could help me out in connection with a case which has been overlooked here for some considerable time. I may say that I have written and telegraphed to Colonel Rendell about it but although he said some considerable time ago that he would look into the matter no definite result has yet been reached.

The case is connected with the estate of the late Corporal Goudie who died in Switzerland shortly after the Armistice, just before he was to be repatriated after being a prisoner. His parents live here and are among our oldest employees, and his father came to me some time ago saying that there was a considerable sum in the neighbourhood of One hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00) of back pay due to his son. I wrote the Militia Department about it and they confirmed this stating that cheque for the amount had been sent to the father,

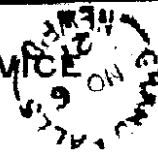
