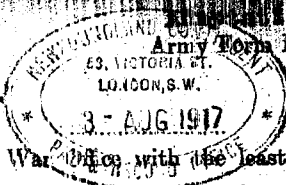





**MESS ALLOWANCE: NEWFOUNDLAND OFFICERS,  
ATTACHED ROYAL FLYING CORPS.**

With reference to your memorandum to the Secretary War Office, Debits 3/994 D.V.J.1691, 23/8/17, relative to claim against the estate of the late 2/Lieut. J.H.S. Green in respect of rations drawn from the 57th Squadron R. F. C, 1 - 2/6/17, £1. 19. 5; It is not quite understood how this amount came to be due by this Officer in view of A. C. I. 1656, which states that a Newfoundland Officer is entitled to receive free rations.

It is suggested that A. C. I. 464 of 1917, which applies only to Canadian Officers, may have been understood to apply to Newfoundland Officers.

During a visit of the deceased Officer to London on leave he called at this office and in the course of conversation stated that he had made certain payments to you on account of rations issued whilst attached to the R. F. C. It was then explained to him that he should receive free rations.

It was understood that on his return to France he was sending a claim to you for payments made under a misapprehension.

Should any similar payments have been made by other Newfoundland Officers, attached to the R. F. C, will you kindly arrange the necessary refunds.
