

I received your letter dated Nov. 27

informing me that nothing is heard of Wallace since he have been missing. After I got the message Nov 27th. That evening going to the office. The operator told me that Wallace turned up with a boy from Old Bonaventure. I was hoping that he was all right. I felt anxious to no I wired you to no. since I got your letter. I have been very uneasy about him poor boy he was the only boy I had in this world his Mother died 9 years ago he were a very sickley boy then. I had got all that I could get for him. and with good care taken he grew stronger. untill the call came for volunteers. he said the call was to him and wanted with others of his companions to obey the call. The group that went there were very young. 15 upward Wallace was 14. it was hard for me to part with him as he was the only child I had with me the two girls were married and gone and I am over sixty years of age.

no person to give me a drink if I am taken sick. if I were to die for the want of it. I have been living in hopes that he wood come home. if he were wounded I wood be more then thankfull. to have him come home. as i am part crippel thirty five years ago I had a chill in my leg it fell in my ancle on the 10. of October took to my bed no docter here at that time on the 22 of may I was taken to st Johns for treatment. Doctor Crowley pronounced a disease of the bone & he told me it could be cured he wood take me to hospitel and cut it off. I didnt care to do that except I wood loose my life by it he told me to go home come back in four months and then he wood take off my foot I came home used cold baths and plasterd with blue clay in winter to keep down infamation. Two years I went on crutches its got better little by little untill it got well enough to do my work hard work and a long walk crippel me up for a while

I am still living in hopes to hear from you that he is all rite. if not what am I going to do my god grant that he will return home is the prayer of a sorrow stricken father

the 28th Brigade who was in charge of
the stretcher bearers at that time.

I am in receipt of your letter of 14 April, regarding my son Private Wallace Halfyard, No. 3793, for which I desire to thank you. I also received information from H.E. The Governor confirming the report of his death, which I must now accept as an indisputable fact.

Private Halfyard was my only son, and being myself an old man of 62 yrs. The blow caused by his death is hardly bearable, and naturally apart from this fills me with forebodings for the future.
