Sir,

I have the honour to bring to your notice for reconsideration, the case of the mother of the above mentioned soldier. Mrs Gorman the mother, states that she has one son who is married and one who is a cripple. The latter is doing work as Government telegraph operator. Mrs Gorman's second husband is dead. She claims that the cripple son is earning only enough to support himself, and the Sergeant who was killed in action on the 9th of October 1917, was her sole support. The records show that Sgt. Harmon's allotment of 55 cents per day, was cancelled on the 30th of April 1917, and it is understood that pension was not considered because of this fact, but a reconsideration of the case is requested please.




