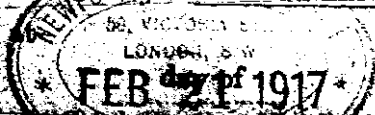

MEMORANDUM

John Hayse, 8 Lime Street, whose son #1239 Patrick J. Hayse was killed in action on July 1st 1916, sets forth that his son's allotment was made payable to his Uncle. In view of the fact that owing to his wife's serious illness and having three children to look after he sent him there to board. He is at present in ill health with heart trouble as per certificate from Dr. Fraser, and feels that some allowance should be made for him through his son's death. This matter should be referred to the Pensions Commissioners for their consideration, and, if possible, an allowance should be made to help him over his present incapacity. He has two sons in Mount Cashel Orphanage, and he is not able to work constantly owing to his disability.





RE PTE. NO. 1239, PATRICK HAYES

There is a dispute between John Hayes, father of the deceased, and Patrick Mallowney, uncle of the deceased, as to who is entitled to an allotment which is still being paid. Patrick Hayes having been killed in action on the 1st of July, 1914. I understand that none of the allotment cheques for some months have been cashed. As the uncle is not a dependent and the father is not or should not be a dependent, and as the only real dependents of the deceased appear to be some infant brothers who are at Mount Cashel Orphanage, I would recommend that the allotments of Patrick Mallowney be discontinued. I also recommend that the balance of the estate to the credit of the deceased on your books be paid to the father of the deceased, John Hayes, whose address is 129 Gower Street. The members of the family who are specially entitled to consideration as dependents are the deceased's infant brothers at Mount Cashel Orphanage. If this allotment has been sent to Mr. Mallowney in error since the death of Patrick Hayes (he not being a dependent), the payment of the cheques might be stopped.

Dear Sir:

I have been consulted by Mr. Patrick J. Hayse, father of 1239 Private Patrick Hayse who enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment February 27th. 1915 and was killed in action July 1st 1916 with reference to the possibility of his obtaining any payment in the nature of War Service Gratuity or Post Pay. Mr. Hayse tells me that his son's allotment was made in favor of his uncle Richard Maloney, 4 Lion's Square, St. John's and that payments were continued up to eighteen months ago and then stopped.

The matter has been before the Pension's Board and I enclose copy of a letter left with me by my client from the Assistant Secretary of the Board. I have advised Mr. Hayse that he is clearly not entitled to a pension but that possibly he may be entitled under the regulations to some payment of the kind indicated above.

I shall be much obliged if you can give this matter your attention and advise me in due course.
