NEWFOUNDLAND CONTINGENT

Report of 690 Sergt. W.G. Smith of the Pay & Record Office, who attended the funeral of 1166 the late Private A.G. Heath, 1st Newfoundland Regiment. 28/4/17

Representing Newfoundland Regiment, reported to 3rd London General Hospital, Wandsworth at 3 p.m.

Met Mrs. and Mrs. E.R. Morris and several friends who had continuously visited late Pte. Heath in Hospital.

Mr. Morris carried Newfoundland flag, with which I draped the coffin, which was covered with many wreaths and crosses, sent by the nursing staff of the Hospital, Australian, Newfoundland and Imperial soldier patients, Capt. and Mrs. Stevens and many others including the War Contingent Association's wreath of laurel and crimson roses.

The coffin was placed on a gun carriage drawn by four horses with mounted drivers and escorted to Wandsworth Cemetery by a firing party from the 11th Territorial Rifle Bn., Wimbledon, arms reversed.

At the Cemetery Chapel a service was held by the Wesleyan minister of Wandsworth, who paid tribute to the pluck and endurance of the young soldier who had suffered great pain over a long period.

At the conclusion of the burial service at the graveside, the usual three volleys were fired and with the bugles sounding the Last Post, the young Newfoundlander was laid to rest.

Some Australians, New Zealanders and Newfoundlanders, who had been wardmates of the late Pte. Heath, gathered at the grave to pay their last respects. Three came on crutches, others had their heads or arms bandaged. They spoke of the qualities which had endeared the Newfoundland Soldier to them all.

The grave is numbered 756 and lies on a slope facing the west.

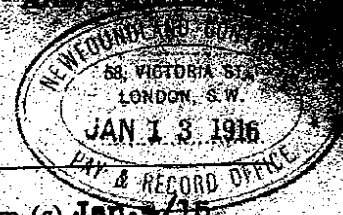
