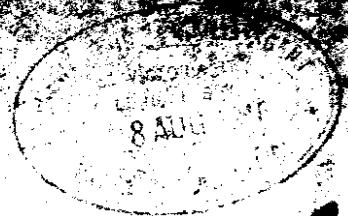

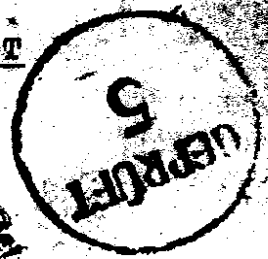

Our Geneva Office advise us that they have received the following letter from the Queen Victoria Jubilee Fund Association:

" Referring to the list of missing men of the 1st Newfoundland Regt., which we published in the circular No. 29, we beg to say that we are informed by the Chief Doctor at the Lazaretto of Cologne, that Pte. Albert Herwood 2298 of the 1st Newfoundland Regt. was brought there on the 24th April 1917 from Valenciennes and died on the 1st May from his wounds. This is so far the first definite report received on this list of Newfoundland men."

In case the relatives have not yet been informed of the Soldier's death, could not a clergyman, physician or nurse, who attended the dying man furnish us with some details of his last hours and burial, so that we could transmit them to the family.

On 28th April he became very ill and in spite of an immediate operation it was not possible to save his life. The consolation and rites of his religion were administered and he died in the presence of his comrades and Germans. He expressed no desires regarding his personal possessions.



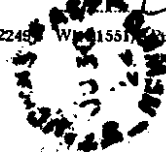
