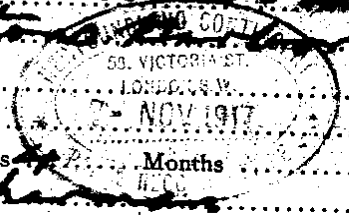

Cable Connection with all the World

All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

P. T. (and the N. P. T. shall have full power so to entrust the Message) for further transmission by or through any system, service, or line of Telegraph belonging to or worked by any administration or authority not controlled by the N. P. T. exclusively, although worked as part of or in connection with the Telegraphic system or service of the N. P. T.

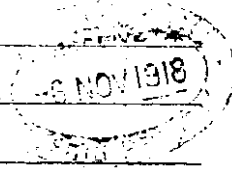
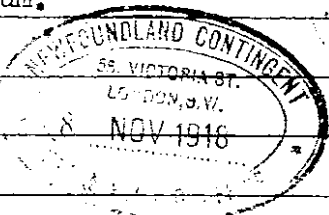

Dear Sir:-

Your letter addressed to the Pay & Pensions Office, London relative to the death of your son, No. 2224 Pte. H. Herwood, has been forwarded to this Department for attention.

With regard to your query regarding the name of the place where your son's death took place: the Battalion moved to Kaiberg, Belgium on the 11th of October, and Pte. Herwood was killed in the engagement on the 20th of that month. We have no further particulars that would enlighten you to any extent.

I would state in reply to the part of your letter re the burial place of Pte. Herwood, that Major T. Hangle has been for some time engaged in the location and registering of soldiers' graves in the different areas of war, and having them concentrated into recognized military cemeteries. When each grave has been removed it will be photographed and a copy sent to the next of kin concerned. It is hoped that Major Hangle will be successful in registering Pte. Herwood's grave, in which event you will be satisfied without delay.

I have made enquiry from the Registrar relative to his estate, and I am informed that there was no will, and letters of administration were issued to you on 17th Jan, 1922, for the balance due to his estate.
