
Dear Mr. Hudson:-

I regret to have to inform you that a report has this day been received from the Record Office of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, London, to the effect that No. 3327, Private George Hudson is at 3rd Australian Casualty Clearing Station, France, dangerously ill March 11th, shell wound right side, both thighs and right arm fractured.

I trust that later reports will bring news of his convalescence.

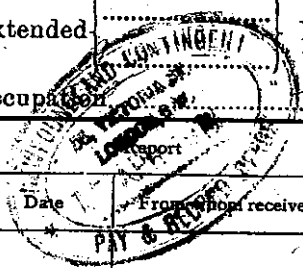


