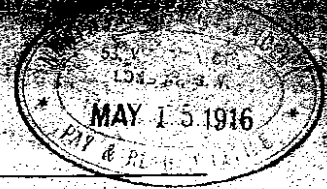

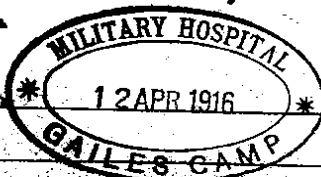

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a telegram from the Record Office, London, reporting that No. 1569, Private Howard Hulan, your dear son, had died in Scotland on the 2nd May.

Permit me to express, on behalf of the Government as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy with you at this time.

While we all feel the sadness connected with the loss of a loved one, yet there is in this case some cheer in the thought that he gave his life to the glorious call - the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Justice. We are proud of our boys who so bravely come forward at the call of duty and we appreciate highly the unselfish loyalty of the fathers and mothers, who so nobly gave their boys for their King and Country. He has laid down his earthly weapons but your boy now wears the soldier's Crown of Victory. His name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen.

I trust that you may have at this time the comfort and consolation of the Great Father of us all.

Referring to my letter of the 3rd May last, in which it was my painful duty to inform you of the death in Scotland on May the 2nd of your son, No. 1568, Private Howard Hulan, and to my further letter of the 5th May, in which I notified you of the cause of his death, I beg to say that I am now in receipt of a report, by mail, which gives further particulars regarding his case, which are as follows:-

He was admitted, on the 31st December 1915, to Croftwood Hospital, suffering from Measles. Shortly after admission, he developed Pneumonia, which later developed into Pulmonary Tuberculosis. He was transferred to Carrick House Auxiliary Hospital on the 15th February last, in which Hospital he was confined to his bed, until his death on May 2nd.

I have no doubt that you will be glad to receive these further particulars with respect to your son's illness and death.



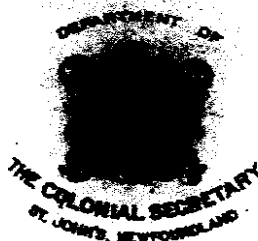


