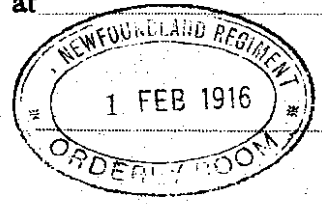



Dear Sir:

I am given to understand that the allotment of \$1533 Pte. F. J. Hussey has been stopped. Private Hussey was killed on July 1, 1916. His allottee was his brother, Thomas Hussey, who is now with the Foresters. I understand, however, that the allottee was not the beneficiary of the allotment, as the money was used for the support of his father and younger sister. Thomas Hussey was made allottee because he was helping to support his father and sister, and his earnings together with the allotment made by Pte. F. J. Hussey supported the family.

I shall be glad if you will look into the matter and see if anything can be done.
