Dear Sir,

In reference to the case of  
Mrs. Rachel Jacobs which I brought to your notice  
a few days ago, I may inform you that I have  
attended to the signing of the papers you furnished,  
and enclosed them herewith.

This woman has never received any separation  
allowance whatever, and, compared with other cases,  
it seems somewhat strange that it has been  
denied her. The father, as you will see from the  
doctor's certificate, is altogether unable to  
support the family, and the earnings of the  
two girls is hardly adequate to maintain  
themselves. I have known this man for the  
past 23 years, and he has always been  
an invalid, and the family has been  
in continued straitened circum-

② The mother has had to work hard for many years to keep the home together, and as far as I can see, will have to return to her work, unless something further is done by your office. Frederick was the only boy and, had he not given his life for his country, would have been their mainstay today. I think if I could take your committee to their home it would require little time and few words to convince its members that in all justice the granting of Separation Allowance would be in order. If a home with a father 80% incapacitated, and his little girls unable to properly maintain themselves, and a mother that must go out as a charwoman is not entitled to Separation Allowance for their very own in the service of King & Empire, then surely mothers must be greatly aggrieved elsewhere. I feel confident that your committee may need to know the conditions to readily grant this family the request the mother makes.
