Dear Mr. Wood,

Upon looking up our records I find that we have but one "Henry James" Regimental number 3330 who was a member of the Windsor Draft. He has been discharged from the Regiment and he is now undergoing treatment in Jensen Camp. His parents reside at 15 Cook Street, St. John's. He was wounded on December 2nd G.S.W. Back, and entered the Third London General Hospital, Wandsworth on December 21st 1917. He returned to Newfoundland on August 5th 1918 and was discharged on September 2nd.

To avoid any mistake with regard to this man's identity I would suggest that you drop a line to Jensen Camp and ask him if he knows the people on behalf of <sup>whom</sup> you are making the inquiry.

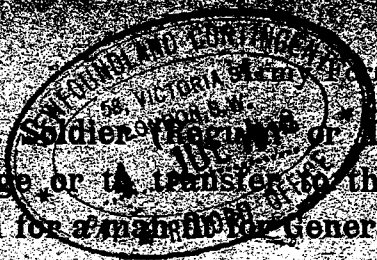

NOTE.—This Army Form will be given to all patients in Hospital to complete who are suffering from a disability sufficiently serious to make discharge or reclassification in a category from which men are being transferred to Class P. or P.(T.) of the Reserve probable. In the event of the man being brought before a Medical Board for discharge, this Army Form will be produced to the Board, together with other documents laid down in para. 3 (ii), item 3, of Army Council Instruction No. 1912, of 1916.

When the soldier who is to be brought before a Medical Board is not a patient in Hospital, and in substitution cases, these instructions will be carried out by the man's C.O.
