"Killed in Action 1/7/18:- 2/Lieut.C.H.O.Jupp,
1st.Newfoundland Regiment."

If articles or personal property of the late 2/Lieut. Jupp are found they will be forwarded to this Office, but some time may probably elapse before their receipt, and will naturally be subject to customary formalities concerning effects.
