Madam,-

Referring to your letter 10/2/16, the latest reports available are that your son, No. 613 Pte. Hubert Keats, was admitted to the 17th. Stationary Hospital, Port Tewfik, Egypt, on 14/2/16. He was stated to be suffering from "N.F.D." which means that his case was not yet diagnosed.

I understand that you had previously written to the Newfoundland War Contingent Association for information, and at their request a cable enquiry was despatched by this Office, and they have written you accordingly. On receipt of your letter a further cable enquiry was despatched from this Office, but so far no reply has been received. Meanwhile as there are no further reports to hand it may be reasonable to assume that his case was not serious, and there would therefore appear to be no grounds for any undue anxiety on his behalf.

With regard to your other son, No. 203 Pte. William Keats, there is no information to indicate but that he is still with the 1st. Battalion.

Opinion of the Medical Board.

Notes.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Minister of Pensions should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable him to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

(ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.

(iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is, (a) caused or aggravated by service in the present war, (b) due to causes not connected with present war, viz. (1) earlier active service, (2) climatic disease in pre-war service, (3) ordinary military service before the war. It is, therefore, essential when assigning the cause of a disability to differentiate between them.

(iv.) In answering question 21 the Board should be careful to discriminate between disease resulting from military conditions and disease to which the soldier would have been equally liable in civil life.

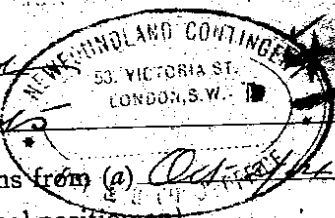
