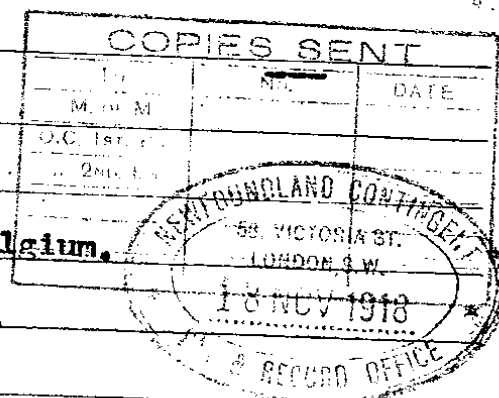





On June 20th, 1919, you sent this Department the records in connection with certain soldiers' estates, and amongst them was the estate of Pte. S. Kelly, #2228, who was stated to have been killed in action on the 27th of October, 1918, and his father, James Kelly of Jersey Side, Placentia, was given as his next of kin. At the same time you sent a copy of the Will of Pte. J. J. Kelly, #2228. By this Will the soldier left all his property and effects to his sister, Miss Anna Kelly, 29 LeMarchant Road, St. John's. On June 23, 1919, a schedule asking for particulars of this soldier's estate was sent to "Miss Anna Kelly, 29 LeMarchant Road, City," but it has not been returned to this Department. On the 12th of June, 1920, another schedule was sent to "Mr. James Kelly, Jersey Side, Placentia," and on June 17th I received a letter from him together with the schedule. From the schedule I gathered that James J. Kelly, #2228, left only one sister, Lillian. On June 19th I wrote Mr. James Kelly enclosing copy of the Will of Pte. J. J. Kelly, #2228, and asked him for information concerning his daughter "Anna." I am now in receipt of a reply from him in which he states that Pte. J. J. Kelly had only one sister, Lillian, and that she did not at any time reside at 29 LeMarchant Road. I notice from the City Directory that there is a family named "Kelly" living at 29 LeMarchant Road. I am returning



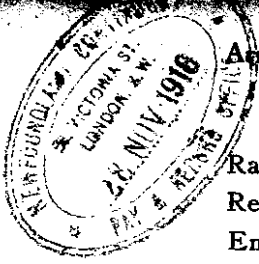
