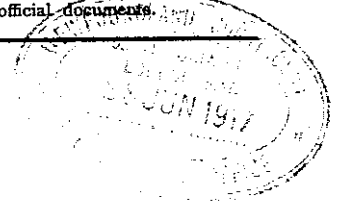

With reference to your letter 10/5/17: In accordance with Financial Instructions and Allowances Canadian Expeditionary Force, 1916, Para. 187, pay ceases from the date that this Soldier was reported missing. In the case of missing Soldiers of Imperial and Canadian Forces it is customary for the period of thirty weeks and six months respectively to expire before they are presumed dead for official purposes. This, however, does not affect pay, as will be seen on reference to A. C. I. 17 of 1917. Statement of non-effective account was sent to the Deputy Paymaster 11/5/17, to whom application should be made for the balance due to the deceased Soldier's estate, please.

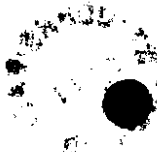
