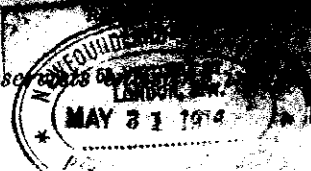

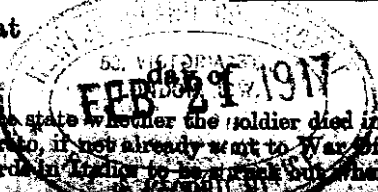

Referring to our conversation of this forenoon and the letter from your Associate Actuary in this matter, I now enclose official confirmation of the death of the above soldier, which has but recently come to hand. I trust it will meet the requirements of your company in the case.

With reference to the system in vogue in Canada re confirmation of reports of death, I would state that no such practice is followed here. The first reports of deaths or other casualties are coublad and accepted as conclusive proof of the casualty recorded. In some cases official confirmations like the enclosed fellow after six or eight weeks ^{from} of the first report.

In the matter of supplying particulars of next of kin, place and date of birth etc., as I mentioned to you this morning, attestations for the first 1600 men were only completed in single copies, and these were taken to London and are at the Record Office there. Copies in part, were made there and referwarded to St. John's


and these latter are the only records existent at this Office. They contain only particulars of the next of kin. Consequently it is impossible to supply, in the cases of the first 1600 men, the information required regarding birth. This information, however
