(1) On the night 9/10th October, I was one of the Transport men leading pack Cobs up to the Battalion with rations and water when a shell burst near us killing Lieut. Goodyear, Cpl. Morgan, Pte. Lilly, Jones, & Simms. He was killed instantly and was I think buried by some R.S.'s next morning

(2) On the night of the 9/10th October, I was with Pte. L. Simms and some others of the Transport men leading Pack Cobs with rations and water which were being brought up to the Battalion when a shell burst among us and killing Lieut. Goodyear, Cpl. 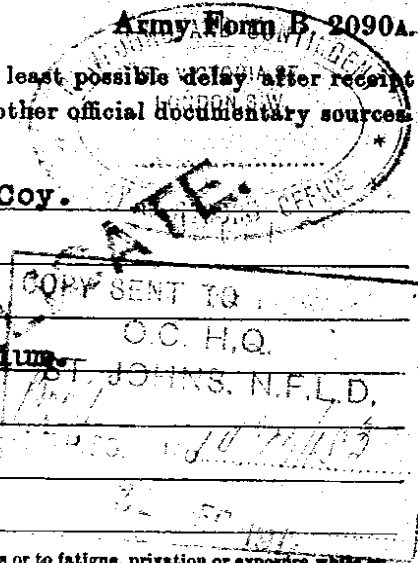

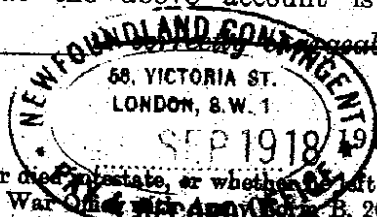
