Dear Sir,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a cablegram from the Record Office, London, intimating that your son, Private Andrew J. Mackay, had died of wounds on the 13th instant.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones but no doubt it will be some consolation to you to think that your brave boy early answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. We are proud of our gallant boys and also of the noble fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their sons when the Call of Duty came. Though your boy has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory and his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won and Peace again reigns upon the earth it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.

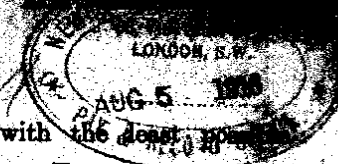

Dear Mrs McKay:

With reference to your enquiry concerning money matters of your son, No. 572 Pte. Andrew McKay, I would state for your information that the balance of his pay up to the time of his death will eventually be notified to this Office by our London Office. His account has not yet come forward, but when it is received it will be forwarded to the Dept. of Justice who will appoint you as Administratrix of his estate, and empower this Dept. to pay you the balance at your son's credit.

On the decease of a soldier, his pay ceases automatically. In many cases soldiers allot part of their pay to their parents or dependents; and in the case where it was allotted to parents, this Department was requested by the Board of Pension Commissioners to continue paying the allotment until such time as they could investigate and decide the claim for pension. I should like to make it particularly clear that an allotment thus continued is not to be considered as part of the soldier's pay, but as the payment on account of any pension that might be due. Incidentally, the Board of Pension Commissioners must refund to this Dept. all such payments made. The procedure after the Board of Pension Commissioners has made its decision as to whether or not the pension is payable is as follows:-

If their ruling is that no pension is due, they request us to cease payment of the allotment, and due notification is given. If their decision is to pay pension

the amount received per allotment cheque is augmented to the monthly pension due; the difference per month since the decease of the soldier to the date of decision is paid in lump cheque; the allotment cheques are no longer issued, and cheques are no longer issued, and cheques for pension become current.

I hope I have made this perfectly clear to you, and I should be glad to supply you with further information that you should request. I am hoping that your son's non-effective account will be shortly received, and we will make an endeavour to have the matter settled as quickly as possible.
