 front of left shoulder with loss of muscle and head of humerus.
 Smaller scar 1 1/2" long behind the shoulder. Over left temporal
 region small scar with four pieces of foreign body beneath the skin.
 Skin over this region is dead to feeling. Can flex the elbow
 fully but cannot raise the shoulder. Small piece of foreign body
 in left thumb. The shoulder joint is a flail-joint from loss of
 head of humerus.

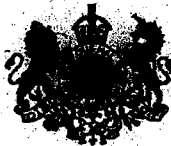
