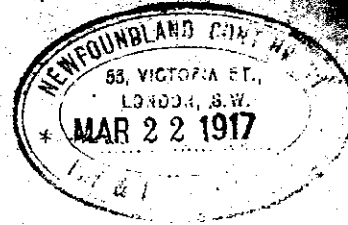

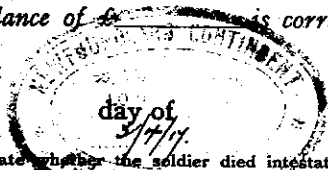

Sir:- 2137 Bandsman Maddock.

Your letter of July 16th respecting this case has been received and note from it that "the question of enlistment of the members of the band at Winchester as been fully considered, and as regards pension and other pay and allowances, they should be treated in the same manner as other members of the Regiment."

Our Board has given this matter very careful consideration and while noting the above decision, are reluctant to finalize this case until they have laid before your Department certain aspects of the case which may possibly have been overlooked by your Department in reaching its decision and which the Board thinks should be brought out very fully so that there may be no misunderstanding in future as to the circumstances underlying this case and the award of a pension in other cases for which it may become a precedent.

The first point that the Board would call your attention to is, that this man, according to his enlistment papers, was 50 years of age, whereas the age for the enlistment, of the men in the Regiment was, so we understand, from 19 to 38, and that if this be so, he was enlisted improperly if for general service, if he was not for general service but for special service as Bandsman, we submit to your Department that it be preferable before a final decision was reached to have the opinion of the ~~legal profession~~ as to whether such an enlistment would entitle his family to a pension on account of his death.

Again we would note the fact that the disease from which he died- Bronchitis- is not certified as having been due to or aggravated by Military Service, and it will be necessary to know that it was one or other of these causes before we can finally determine a liability in this matter.

On the surface it appears as if this middle-aged Musician, after having served as Bandsman for many years with various Regiments, joined the Newfoundland Regiment with those in charge at Winchester fully aware of his age, occupation, and intended employment etc., that he only served nine months and that he died from natural causes in no way attributable to Military Service, (and Major Knight of the Regiment who was Medical Officer at Winchester at the time informs us that members of the Band were not subject to any strain, exposure or other circumstances which would form a hardship upon them) and in view of the fact that the Board is obliged from time to time to decline to grant pensions to the people of this country, members of whose families enlisted for general service and died on Active Service, the Board is of the opinion that the legal liability in this case should be determined upon beyond any question of doubt before a pension is awarded under the circumstances which appear to surround this case.
