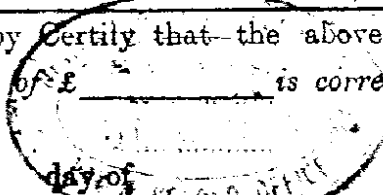

I beg to inform you that the late Pte. Chesley Marks was buried with full military honours at Brookwood Cemetery on 5/8/18. The Firing and Bugle Parties consisted of men from the London Rifle Brigade. The service was conducted by the Rev. E. H. Hearn, C.F. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack. Pte. Marks was buried in Grave No. 181388, Newfoundland plot. A rose and laurel chaplet from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association was laid upon the coffin. The coffin bore the following inscription:
Chesley Marks,
Royal Newfoundland Regt.,
Died 31st July 1918,
Aged 20 years.

Amongst those who attended at the grave-side were the wife and little daughter of the deceased. 767 ~~Cpl.~~ A.S. Harvey of the P.A.R.O. Staff, London, represented the Newfoundland Contingent.

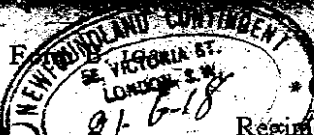
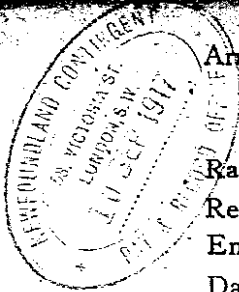

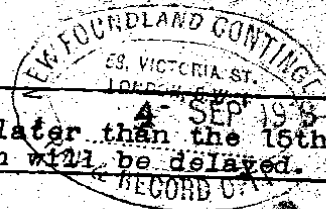
