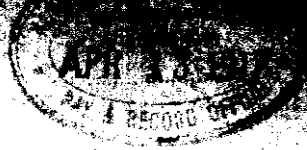

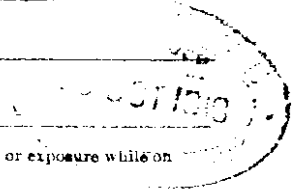
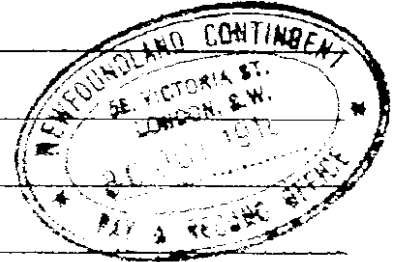
All private documents and effects received from the front or hospital, as well as the Pay Book, should be examined, and if any will is found it should be at once forwarded to the War Office.



Dear Sir:-

Having called at the Dept of Militia a number of times, concerning the allotment of my late brother, No. 3250 Pte. John Moores, of Blackhead in Dist of Bay de Verde, I have not at any time when I called at that Dept. received any answer that was satisfactory

I would respectfully ask you Sir as Prime Minister of this Dominion, the following 1-

- (1) Why his allotment was stopped immediately after he was killed
- (2) and for what reason
- (3) And why it is that one cannot get a satisfactory answer at Militia Dept.

Sir Richard:-

I am in receipt of your letter of June 15th, forwarding letter from Mr. Allan Moores, brother of No. 3250 Pte. John Moores, deceased.

In reply to the questions raised by Mr. Moores, I would state that the pay accounts of his brother have been handled in accordance with regulations and the practice that has obtained in this Department all through. Private Moores was killed on 5th October, 1918, and automatically his pay ceased at the end of that month. As the allotment referred to by Mr. Moores is the assignment of his pay made by Private Moores to his sister, Miss Alice May Moores, that of course ceased at the end of October, 1918. Allotments were ~~continued~~ at the request of the Pensions Board when it was payable to a parent and until such time as the Pensions Board decided on a claim for pension on account of a deceased soldier. War Service Gratuities is not payable on account of a deceased soldier; and a pension is payable only where it is shown that a person was mainly dependent on that soldier.

I am returning Mr. Moores' letter herewith, please.
