Dear Sir,

I regret to inform you that your son, No. 2036, Private Luke Mugford, who was officially reported Missing on October 12th, 1916, is now officially believed to have been Killed in Action on that date.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that your son willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honour, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.

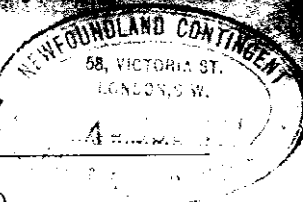

Dear Madam:-

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 11th Feb. dealing with the matter of pay on account of No. 2036, Private Luke Hugford.

I will explain that, when a soldier is leaving and makes an allotment to a dependent, it is done at his own volition. If a soldier is killed in action, or has died of wounds, his pay ceases. Where an allotment has been payable to a dependent, the matter is referred to the Pensions Board, who decide whether or not the dependent is to be paid any pension. If the claim for pension is allowed, this Dept. is requested to continue payment of allotment on account of any pension that might subsequently be granted.

The \$18.00 per month has been continued to you under this arrangement. And when the Pension Commissioners have been appointed by the Government, these payments of allotment will cease, and payments will be paid in full from the pension at the disposal of the Pension Commissioners.

I trust this explanation is satisfactory, and I should be glad to give any further information if you will address a letter to this Department.
