Dear Sir,

I received your letter which was dated 25/10/17 regarding
ten shillings which I had written for. Well, Sir, if you
please don't send me only on (? more than) ten shillings
because I won't be in need of it. If I want any more than
ten shillings I will let you know. With regard to parcels,
I am receiving them regularly but in very poor condition. I
have received my boots, tunic and pants, but not my undercloth-
ing. I wish it would soon come along because I am very much
in need of it. Send me some Nfid tobacco and pipe. If you
have had any news from home let me know, because I am very
anxious to hear. I hope you will receive this letter safely.

Dear Mrs. Mattford,

Your daughter Miss Mattford called this afternoon with reference the non receipt of letters and parcels by #2464 Pte. G. Mattford who is a prisoner of War in Germany. I informed her no doubt she will inform you that it is not permissible for private parties to forward parcels owing to the War Office regulations now in force. Food parcels are despatched at the rate of three per fortnight to every soldier. As soon as he has been reported as a prisoner of war. It sometimes happens that the only address given is Limburg, in which case parcels and letters are detained at Limburg until the soldier has been sent to the registered concentration camp. I am forwarding copy of the regulations governing the sending of parcels to prisoners of War, and will be glad to give any information you may desire.
