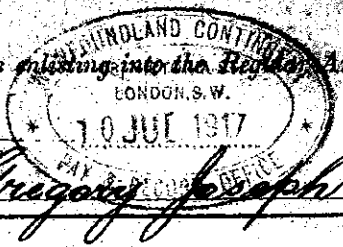

Admitted from Ayr to 4th B. I. L. D. 6th April 1914, suffering from severe Stenoptysis of two days duration, with a history of gastric troubles and cough for a considerable time. Arrived in Britain from Newfoundland April 1915. Sent to Dardanelles Nov. 1915. thence to Egypt where he was in Hosp. three weeks with Gastritis. Sent to France March 1916. Wounded in left hand July 16. Returned to Britain: Admitted to Fulham Hosp. London: Resident there six months discharged (wounds healed) and sent to Depot Ayr Camp 1914. States he caught a heavy cold in Egypt and has been coughing more or less since.

Right lung apparently healthy. Left lung presents marked evidence of disease. In front-percussion note is normal, but fine crepitations are heard with inspiration from apex downwards as low as fifth rib. Posteriorly the percussion note is comparatively dull over the supra. Spinous fossa and fine crepitations are heard here during inspiration and slightly increased I: P. Rales are also heard but of a coarser character right-down to base. Sputum is purulent & mucumular and contains ~~Tubercle~~ Tubercle Bacilli. Heart sounds pure, but action rapid. Has evening temperatures. Abdominal organs apparently healthy.

Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

- (ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.
- (iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is attributed to (a) active service, (b) climate, or (c) ordinary military service. It is therefore essential when assigning the cause of the disability to differentiate between them (see Articles 1162 and 1165, Pay Warrant, 1913.)

I am in receipt of your letter 4488/2 HA/RC, of 12th inst.
regarding 1343, Pte. G. J. Neville.

It is regretted that your instructions to transfer this
man to Ayr cannot be complied with. Neville suffers from
Tuberculosis, and in the opinion of the Medical Officer under
whose care he is, he is quite unfit to travel to Ayr.
As a matter of fact he has never been out of bed, and he would
require to travel on a stretcher. I communicated with Ayr
this afternoon pointing out these circumstances, but could get
little information apart from the request that the man be sent to
Allan's Offices, Liverpool. Such a procedure, however, is not
advisable and a more definite arrangement would require to be
made. As Neville's disability is of an infectious nature, the
Shipping authorities might even refuse to take him on the ship.
As you wish this man transferred on the 17th, I shall be
glad if you will kindly telegraph instructions.

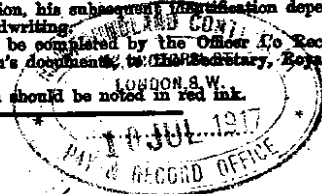
Descriptive Return of a Soldier discharged on account of Disability.
