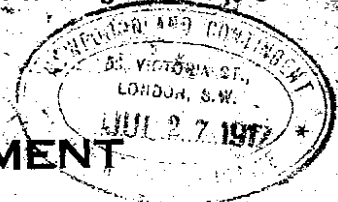

Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th inst., asking if the message which you wished to be sent to your boy, who was reported ill, reached him. Immediately upon its receipt, it was wired to the other side of the water. There is no doubt that it would be delivered to him, as he lingered for ten days after the first report of illness. I think therefore that you can be quite satisfied that he received your last messages of sympathy and love.

In relation to the statement appearing in the newspapers, giving the number of recruits from various settlements, I quite agree with you that the Dock was not represented properly. You most certainly should have got credit for the numbers sent forward from your settlement, which certainly constituted a splendid showing. However, these returns in the papers are not official and they are certainly not correct in every particular. The Committee which looks after the work does the best possible, but I know quite a number of instances in which the returns have not been complete or correct. I shall inform the person in charge of this work of the very splendid record the Dock has made in this connection, so that he may be aware of what you have done.

The nomenclature Committee recommended the changing of

the name Dock to Kitchener. The notice published in the papers is to call the attention of the people to the same, so that if they object to the change, they might make the proper representation. Now this notice expires on the 22nd of this month. If the people residing in the Dock do not desire this change, they should at once get up a petition, have it signed by all the people and send it to this office without delay. I shall then submit it to the Nomenclature Committee for their consideration.

He was taken to hospital about June 14<sup>th</sup> and died July 17.

We have received one pound with a few other things. (all) so far as we can find out that he spent, was what he paid for his tea one evening.
