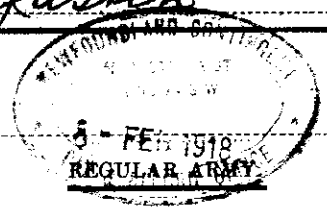

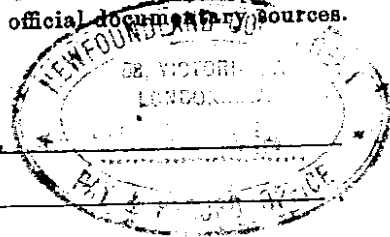

I stayed at the Dressing Station until I saw L/C. O'Brien taken away by 4 R.A.M.C. orderlies to another Dressing Station.



With reference to your enquiry regarding the effects of your son No. 3476 L/C. Justin O'Brien, deceased and also your request that application be made for a photograph of his grave, I have to inform you that in reply to our communication to the Chief Paymaster, London instructing that endeavours be made to accede to your request, a letter has to-day been received which informs us that application was made to the D.G.G.R. & R. for a photograph of your son's grave, and if one is procurable it will be forwarded to you when received.

With reference to the effects, we are informed that none were recovered, owing to the Battalion being constantly on the move in Oct. last when ~~Mr.~~ O'Brien died of wounds and communication with Rear Headquarters was very difficult and frequently impossible. It is regretted that fuller information cannot now be obtained as practically all other ranks who were with their Units at that time have been demobilised and repatriated.
