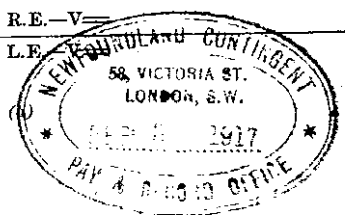

### All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

T. over the Message shall be deemed to have entirely ceased for the purposes of these Conditions at any point where, in the course of the transit of the Message to its destination, it may be entrusted by the N. P. T. (and the N. P. Dear Mrs O'Rielly:-

I am writing to you as a stranger but a very great friend of your son Willie who is now reported Missing since December 3rd. 1917. Well Mrs O'Rielly I very much sympathise with you over this sad news, but I am writing to tell you that you've got to live in very great hopes of your son Willie being a Prisoner of War. I was with Willie from the 20th November up to the 30th. Willie was just on an outpost with several others and the Germans rushed the post and captured all of them, I was wounded myself so Mrs O'Rielly you've got to live in very great hopes of Willie being a Prisoner.

Myself and Willie enlisted together, I belong to Dunville, I don't ever remember seeing you but as a great friend of Willie I said I would write you, anything you would want to find out I would be too pleased to tell you, my address is on the first starting of the letter.

With good wishes and hoping you'll have word from Willie soon.

With reference to your enquiry of 22nd Feb. concerning No. 2118 Private William O'Reilly and the attached letter from L/Cpl. Bird to the mother of this soldier, I have to state that reply has now been received from the Record Office, London, enclosing copy of letter exchanged with the Officer Commanding 2nd Battalion, with which L/Cpl. Bird is now serving.

It appears that L/Cpl. Bird was questioned and stated that Pte. O'Reilly was in A Company, and that some of the men in A Company's advanced posts were taken prisoners. No further definite information is available at present, but if anything further should come to hand concerning this soldier, information will be forwarded at once.


Dear Sir:-
