Gentlemen:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated March 5, 1942 allowing my application for pension with respect to my late son, 2nd. Lieut. Frank O'Toole.

With respect to my husband John Miller, it is impossible for me to get a formal certificate of his death. My husband left me on the 15th day of April, 1930, and I have never heard from him since that time. I made many efforts to try to locate him but without success. I never took any legal proceedings to have my husband declared legally dead because of his continued absence. I did not think that it was necessary. However, because of his continued absence and because of my investigations, I am convinced that my husband is dead. However, there are no records in the City of New York showing the death of my husband.

Because of this continued absence of my husband that I made an application that he was dead.

About a year ago, I was working and was able to support myself. This is because of the fact that I was able to support myself. I made no application for a pension. Now that I am unemployed, I have made this application.

If you have any other information with reference to my application, I would be most grateful if you could get this information for me.

I enclose herewith the declaration and signature statement which were handed to me. Both of these documents have been duly signed.

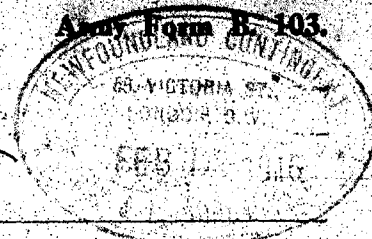
