

Referring to your letter of 15th. inst., I beg to state that Private George R. Pardy has made an allotment in favour of his wife, but has made no provision for his father.

As far as the father's being entitled to an allowance is concerned, I might state respectfully, that no person has any title to a portion of any soldier's pay, except such as is vested in him by the soldier himself. A lot of our people seem to have the idea that they should get a portion of their relatives pay, even though the said relative, who has complete control of the pay, does not see fit to make them any allotment.

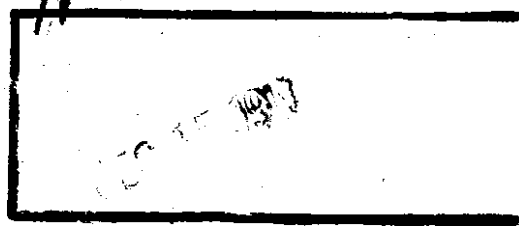

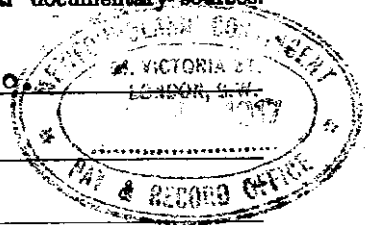
