Sir,

Will you kindly let me know what payments have been made into the Bank of Montreal in the joint names of Mrs. Sarah Phillips and her son, Pte. George Phillips, 1164 First Newfoundland Regt. I understand that Pte. Phillips is reported "missing" from the 12th of October, 1916.

This allotment was I understand for the support of Pte. Phillips' mother who was drawing on the amount to the joint account of both. Mrs. Phillips is complaining that the allotments have been stopped while in other cases they are continued. She is virtually in the same class as if she has been named allottee.

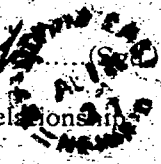

88th Brigade Lists.

"Displayed conspicuous gallantry in the raid 27/28 June south of Beaumont Hamel. He entered the enemy's trench and accounted for several of the enemy single handed. After getting out of trench he went back again to try and obtain some identification. Remained out all night, and had to cut his way back through enemy's wire. This man also took part in the attack south of Beaumont Hamel on July 1st and showed great gallantry. He was wounded on this date."
