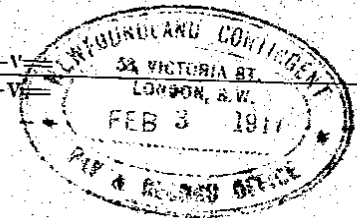

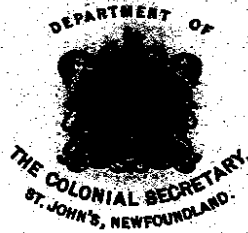

Dear Madam,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 20th instant, making enquiry regarding your brother, Private H. D. Ridout. News of his being wounded reached this office on the 10th instant and on the 20th July we received further particulars, stating that he had been admitted to Clendon Park Hospital at Guildford, England, and that he was suffering from gunshot wounds in the forearm and back. These wounds are not described as serious but simply severe and, from such description, we do not anticipate any ill result but simply that he may take a little longer to reach complete recovery.

to know whether the above mentioned person is
believed killed, or a prisoner of war.

In reply to your letter of the 25th July, I regret to say that no information has been received, respecting No. 1595, Lance Corporal H. G. Ridout, since the report that he was missing on April 14th. A large percentage of the men of the First Newfoundland Regiment, who were missing after the Action of that date, have since been reported Prisoners of War in Germany, and there is every reason to hope that others will yet be reported, amongst whom I trust will be your brother. Should any further tidings respecting him be received, I shall communicate the same to you.
